NEWS RELEASE:

John D. "Jack" Drummey has resigned his position as Assistant to the City Manager-Public Relations in an announcement issued by him.

Coming to his position in December of 1974 and becoming very active in civic and government affairs, Drummey received a letter from City Manager James L. Sullivan who accepted the resignation with "sincere regret".

Sullivan added that "in the more than two years..in this vital and sensitive position as Public Relations Director for the City of Cambridge you have conveyed ...to the media ... and the "publics" of Cambridge a true sense of what we are trying to accomplish in this City. Your expertise in this area is appreciated by both the elected and appointed City officialsWe are extremely grateful for your contributions."

While serving in his position Drummey has received awards from the American Cancer Society, American Red Cross, Greek-American Club, U.S. Bond Drive and others. One of Boston's better known "p.r." men Drummey had been public relations director for G.E., State Mutual of America, Cahners Publishing and Associated Industries of Mass. He was indefinite about his future plans but he did say he would soon issue a report on his opinions of the public relations problems facing Cambridge.

At Monday night's Council meeting an order commending Drummey for his work was introduced by Councillors Thomas W. Danehy and Walter J. Sullivan.

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
