MASSACHUSETTS

In City Council, January 31, 1922.

RESOLVED:

That the public convenience and public health require that a common sewer should be laid in Blakeslee Street, a private way so-called, and that a right of way twenty (20) feet in width through the middle of said street should be taken for such purpose and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the westerly line of Blakeslee Street 319 ft. southerly from the intersection of said line with the southerly line of Huron Avenue, thence running easterly 20.12 ft. to the intersection of the division line between land formerly of F. A. Kennedy and land of the Devises of Charles C. Read et al, thence southerly along said division line 54 ft., thence westerly (parallel to and 10 ft. distant northerly from the southerly line of Blakeslee Street) 103 ft., thence northerly at right angles 20 ft., thence westerly by a line parallel to and 30 ft. northerly from said southerly line about 83 ft., thence northerly (along the westerly line of Blakeslee Street extended southerly) about 33 ft. to the point of beginning. Containing 2,730 square feet more or less.

The above described parcel of land is shown on a plan entitled: "Sewer Plot of Blakeslee Street," drawn by L. M. Hastings, City Engineer of Cambridge, Mass., dated November 25, 1921.

ORDERED:

That due notice be given the owners of land abutting on said private way, between the points before mentioned, and all other persons interested, in the manner prescribed by law, that this Board intends to take a certain parcel of land, bounded and described above, for the purpose of laying, making and maintaining a common sewer therein, and that Tuesday, February 14th, at 8:30 P. M. and the Council Chamber, City Hall, are assigned as the time and place for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.

In City Council, December 6th, 1921.

RESOLVED:

That the public convenience and public health require that a common sewer should be laid in Blakeslee Street, a private way so-called, and that a right of way twenty (20) feet in width through the middle of said street should be taken for such purpose and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Huron Avenue at the division line between land of Frank A. Kennedy and land of Sarah Sorkin, thence running easterly along said southerly line of Huron Avenue 10.36 feet, thence southerly by a line parallel to and 10 feet easterly from the said division line 322.58 feet to land of Read, thence westerly 20.12 feet, thence northerly by a line 10 feet westerly from the said division 319.42 feet to Huron Avenue, thence easterly along the said southerly line of Huron Avenue 10.36 feet to the point of beginning.

Containing 6,420 square feet.

The above described parcel of land is shown upon a plan entitled: "Plan of Land in Cambridge belonging to Jacob Sorkin," drawn by W. A. Mason & Son, Surveyors, dated February 1, 1917, and on file in the office of the City Engineer of Cambridge, Mass.
