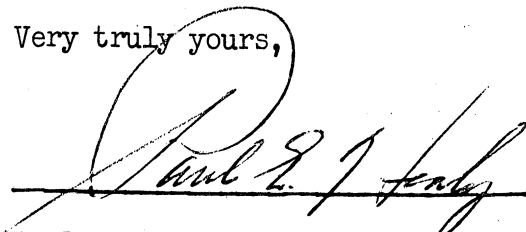

COUNCILLOR WYLIE

RESOLVED:

That the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, U.S.A., hereby resolves to request the appropriate officials of Kenya to make public the reasons for the arrest of George Anyona, Maina Wa Kinyatti, Al-Amin Mazrui, Kamoji Wachira and Wangonde Kariuki, and to advise whether the rights of these persons are being observed under the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As elected government officials in a democratic society, the Cambridge City Councillors wish to say to Kenya officials that political activity should never result in the violation of a person's liberty, and further that disregard of the personal rights of members of political opposition creates a destabilizing force in the world.
