Edward Largey, 75

Decorated for valor in WWII

Edward Largey of Quincy, a retired sales manager and a distinguished World War II veteran, died Thursday at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital in Boston of respiratory failure. He was 75.

Born in South Boston and raised in Roslindale, Mr. Largey was educated in Boston schools.

While serving in the Marines during World War II, Mr. Largey received the Purple Heart and the Silver Star after being wounded during combat in Okinawa on April 16, 1945.

After being hit, he was able to advance up a slope in the face of enemy fire, using hand grenades to destroy a machine-gun emplacement.

He participated in the ceremony marking the surrender of Japanese military forces near Tsingtao, China, on Oct. 25, 1945.

Mr. Largey was a retired sales manager for the Puritan Ice Cream Co. of Boston.

He leaves two sons, Edward Jr. of Cambridge and James of Somerville; three sisters, Mary Scott of Scituate, Catherine Penning of Roslindale, and Helen Molloy of Virginia; two grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow at 11 a.m. in St. Agatha's Church in Milton. Burial will follow at 1:30 p.m. at the Massachusetts Veteran's National Cemetery in Bourne with a Marine honor guard.
