The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Three.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A LOCAL OPTION PUBLIC SAFETY EXCISE TAX ON CERTAIN EXEMPT INSTITUTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause 3 of section 5 of chapter 59 as appearing
2 in the 1990 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the
3 following: —

4 (f) In any city or town which accepts the provisions of Chap-
5 ter 59B, real property which is exempt pursuant to clause third
6 shall, for such privilege, be subject to an excise tax in the manner
7 provided by said chapter 59B.

1 SECTION 2. The General Laws are hereby amended by
2 inserting the following: —

3 CHAPTER 59B. 4 PUBLIC SAFETY EXCISE TAX.

5 Section 1. Real property which is otherwise exempt pursuant
6 to clause 3, section 5 of chapter 59 shall, for such privilege,
7 annually be assessed a local public safety excise tax as provided
8 in this chapter.

9 Section 2. The excise shall be one-half percent of the fair cash
10 value of the real property as determined in the manner pursuant
11 to section 38 of chapter 59.

12 Section 3. The excise shall be assessed, abated, collected, and
13 for all other purposes administered in the manner provided in
14 chapter 59 and 60 of the General Laws.

15 Section 4. This chapter shall only take effect in a city or town
16 which accepts the provisions of this chapter in the manner
17 provided in this chapter.
