- WHEREAS: The flag of the United States is a daily reminder of the beliefs and values to which we are called to give life as well as a poignant reminder of those who have given their lives for the life of these values; and
- WHEREAS: When a symbol is trashed, the reality of which the symbol is a sign is also done damage. This fact is no less true when the object of trashing is the flag of the United States; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this Council supports the initiative of President George Bush that there be an Amendment to the U.S. Constitution which will affirm that " The Congress and the states shall have power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States " ; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and is requested to prepare duly engrossed copies of this Resolution and transmit same to the President of the United States and all members of the Massachusetts Congressional Delegation.
