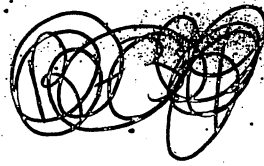

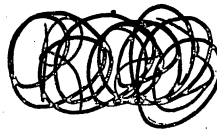

Solomon Barkin, 92

Labor economist taught at UMass

LEVERETT — Solomon Barkin, a labor economist, writer, and professor, died March 29 in his Leverett home. He was 92.

Mr. Barkin was director of research for the Textile Workers Union from 1937 to 1963 and then headed the social affairs division of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development in Paris. He taught at the University of Massachusetts in Amherst from 1968 until his retirement in 1978.

His books included "The Decline of the Labor Movement and What Can Be Done About It," and "Worker Militancy and Its Consequences, 1965-75." He leaves his wife of 59 years, three children, and three grandchildren.
