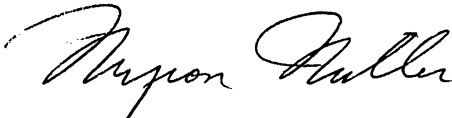

We, the undersigned, wish to petition the Cambridge City Council to reconsider and to hold a public hearing on the plan for renovation and rebuilding of the Cambridge High Schools approved by the School Committee on November 14, 1974. While we appreciate the concept of up to date facilities for Cambridge's high school programs, (1) we feel that the particular plan approved was inadequately considered in relation to other plans for this site by the School Committee, (2) that certain aspects of the proposed plan are in direct contradiction to prior feasibility studies undertaken by the School Committee, (3) that it does not represent the best use of the available site and, (4) that it will be detrimental to the interests of the surrounding neighborhood and the City of Cambridge.

The new Cambridge High and Latin building will take over a major part of the heavily utilized park surrounding the Public Library, which is the only sizable public open space in the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood. It will result in a reduction of the total open space available on this site, and the destruction of numerous large, mature trees, which cannot be replaced except over many years.

We believe that it is possible to achieve the goals for the Cambridge high schools without infringing upon the existing park space.
