

Know all Men by these Presents,

THAT I, **Kenneth W. Tippett** of **94 Rice Street, Cambridge, Ma.** as PRINCIPAL

and **The American Insurance Company, 1 Center Plaza, Boston, Ma.** as Surety

are holden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto the CITY OF CAMBRIDGE in the full and just sum of **Three Thousand (\$3,000)** DOLLARS, to be paid unto the said City. To which payment, well and truly to be made, we firmly bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns by these presents. Witness our hand and seals. Dated the **10th** day of **January** in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and **Seventy-eight**.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That the aforesaid

Kenneth W. Tippett

having been appointed by the City Manager of the City of Cambridge one of the Constables within the said City, for the term ending ^{three} ~~one~~ year from the first Monday in January, 19 **78**, and until another be appointed in his place, now if said **Kenneth W. Tippett** shall faithfully exercise all the powers and perform all the duties entrusted to and imposed upon him by the laws of the Commonwealth and the ordinances of the City of Cambridge; shall carefully intend the preservation of the peace, the discovery and prevention of all attempts against the same; shall duly execute all warrants which shall be sent unto him from lawful authority, and faithfully attend to all such directions in the laws and orders of Court, as are or shall be committed to his care; shall comply with the orders and directions of the City Manager and Council, which shall be passed from time to time for the regulation of the Constables; shall faithfully and with what speed he can, collect and levy all such fines, distresses, rates, assessments, and sums of money for which he shall have sufficient warrants according to law, rendering an account thereof, and paying the same according to the direction in his warrant; and also, if he shall faithfully perform all the duties of a Constable in the service of all civil processes which may be committed to him, then this obligation shall be void, otherwise it shall remain in full force and effect.

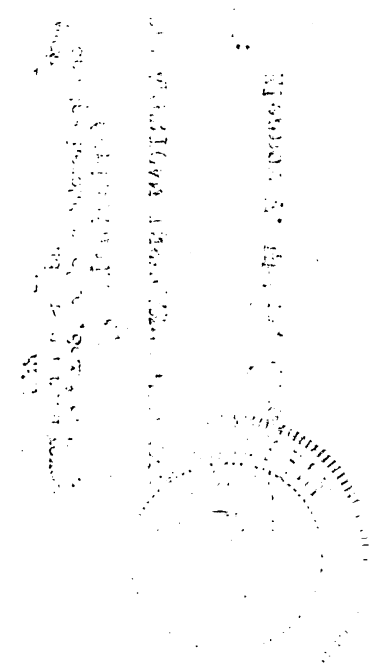

its true and lawful Attorney(s)-in-Fact, with full power and authority hereby conferred in its name, place and stead, to execute, seal, acknowledge and deliver any and all bonds, undertakings, recognizances or other written obligations in the nature thereof -----

and to bind the Corporation thereby as fully and to the same extent as if such bonds were signed by the President, sealed with the corporate seal of the Corporation and duly attested by its Secretary, hereby ratifying and confirming all that the said Attorney(s)-in-Fact may do in the premises.

This power of attorney is granted pursuant to Article VIII, Section 30 and 31 of By-laws of THE AMERICAN INSURANCE COMPANY now in full force and effect.

"Article VIII, Appointment and Authority of Resident Assistant Secretaries, and Attorney-in-Fact and Agents to accept Legal Process and Make Appearances.

Section 30. Appointment. The Chairman of the Board of Directors, the President, any Vice-President or any other person authorized by the Board of Directors, the Chairman of the Board of Directors, the President or any Vice-President, may, from time to time, appoint Resident Assistant Secretaries and Attorneys-in-Fact to represent and act for and on behalf of the Corporation and Agents to accept legal process and make appearances for and on behalf of the Corporation.

Section 31. Authority. The Authority of such Resident Assistant Secretaries, Attorneys-in-Fact, and Agents shall be as prescribed in the instrument evidencing their appointment, and any such appointment and all authority granted thereby may be revoked at any time by the Board of Directors or by any person empowered to make such appointment."

This power of attorney is signed and sealed under and by the authority of the following Resolution adopted by the Board of Directors of THE AMERICAN INSURANCE COMPANY at a meeting duly called and held on the 28th day of September, 1966, and that said Resolution has not been amended or repealed:

"RESOLVED, that the signature of any Vice-President, Assistant Secretary, and Resident Assistant Secretary of this Corporation, and the seal of this Corporation may be affixed or printed on any power of attorney, on any revocation of any power of attorney, or on any certificate relating thereto, by facsimile, and any power of attorney, any revocation of any power of attorney, or certificate bearing such facsimile signature or facsimile seal shall be valid and binding upon the Corporation."
