In response to Councillor Daniel Clinton's request of December 15, 1975, I submit the following:

Status Report on 109 Windsor Street

Review of the City's records on all contracts between the City of Cambridge and NFCC, Inc. reveals that all contracts have expired, and all funds due NFCC, Inc. under those contracts have been expended.

I have directed the Department of Community Development to conduct an audit of all contracts to date between the City and NFCC, Inc. This audit is scheduled for mid-January 1976 when the accountant responsible for the NFCC's books during the relevant period the City had contractual ties with NFCC, Inc. returns from vacation.

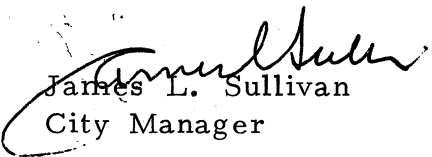
A request has been made to the President of NFCC, Inc. for all records and reports which might clarify the NFCC fiscal situation.

The City has been beseeched by I.R.S. and other debtors of NFCC, Inc. for payment of obligations incurred by NFCC, Inc.

The Law Department advises me that the City has no legal obligation to pay the debts of NFCC, Inc.; and further advises that an expenditure of municipal funds for such payment of debts would not be legal under the Municipal Finance Law.

At the present time Cambridge City Hospital is providing pediatric services at 109 Windsor Street. The staff consists of: two Pediatric Nurse Practitioners, under the supervision of Dr. Philip Porter; one full-time Health Aide; a W.I.C. Aide; a Spanish Interpreter; and a Pediatric Health Aide, who coordinates with the schools.
