AT&T COMMUNICATIONS OF NEW ENGLAND, INC.

AT&T Communications of New England, Inc., has filed with the Department of Public Utilities, proposed tariff changes. These changes include expansion of the description of Calling Card Service, Modification of Beep Tones used in recording of telephone conversations, clarifications of certain service charges, removal of restrictions on the resale and sharing of WATS and Private Line Services, and increases in certain WATS usage rates. The Department has suspended the operations of the rates and charges and conditions contained in the proposal until March 3, 1985.

The Department will conduct a public hearing at its hearing-room, #1210 Leverett Saltonstall Building, 100 Cambridge Street, Boston, Massachusetts on Wednesday, October 31, 1984 at 10:00 AM.
