WHEREAS:

Robert I. Paine, son of John J. and Mary Cahill Paine of No. 3 St. Mary Road, Cambridge enlisted in the United States Marine Corps on January 16, 1942 and was killed in action in the Solomon Islands August 1942

AND WHEREAS:-

He was the first young man in the neighborhood to give his life in his country's cause in World War II it is therefore

ORDERED:-

That the Board of Park Commissioners be and hereby are requested to name the mothers' rest located at the corner of Amory Street and St. Mary Road "The Robert I. Paine Playground" in honor and memory of a boy who sacrificed his life in order that all people and especially mothers and their children may in the future have security, comfort and freedom.

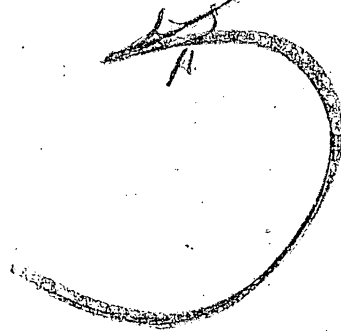
