Beatrice Marie Bowie, 90, of Westwood died Sunday, December 31 at Clark House. Mrs. Pereira was born in New York City on May 19, 1910, daughter of Edward Mandell Bowie and Beatrice Wilhelmine Helleberg Bowie. She was educated in Paris, at the May School in Boston, and at Oxford where she met her future husband, H. Felix deCourcy Pereira. They were married in 1930 in Sharon and lived in Dedham for most of their 70 years of life together until Mr. Pereira's recent death on September 6. Mrs. Pereira was fluent in English, Danish, and French, and she was an accomplished craftswoman, gardener, and gourmet cook. She was active in community affairs, serving the League of Women Voters, the Dedham Community House, and the Boston YWCA, among others. She was also a member of the Boston Athenaeum and the Women's City Club. She leaves a daughter Penelope Pereira Johnson of Sarasota, Florida and Falmouth, Maine; a son, Peter Pereira of Chicago; five grandchildren, Tamara Hammer, Kathryn Pereira, Laura Pereira, Hannah Johnson, and Jonathan Pereira; and one great-grandson, Samuel Doyle.
