- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that during the month of December, 1981 there were a series of breaks and vandalism at the Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, resulting in the loss of a tremendous amount of camera equipment used by the School Department; and
- WHEREAS: Without this equipment, students were being deprived of an opportunity to learn an occupation and to enhance their academic ability; and
- WHEREAS: Members of the Detective Bureau of our Police Department, under the direction of Sergeant Allen Hayes, along with security officials of our high school joined forces to investigate these breaks and in fact were instrumental in determining a prime suspect; and
- WHEREAS: As a result of this ongoing investigation Detective Aurelio Ferreira received information on January 18, 1982 which resulted in his obtaining a search warrant for a building in Somerville, at which time upon execution of the warrant thirty-two (32) Kodak Instamatic cameras along with assorted stereo equipment were recovered; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere congratulations for outstanding investigative work to Detective Sergeant Allen Hayes and Detectives Thomas Collins, Aurelio Ferreira and Spencer Franklin of the Juvenile Bureau as well as Sidney Yeldell, Security Chief at the High School and his staff; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to each individual on behalf of the entire City Council.

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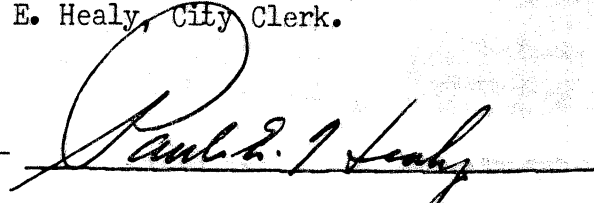
