police appointed pursuant to section 10 of chapter 22C, and is a member in service of the system, which is received on such a day by the member on account of service rendered by him on or after July 1, 1996, and not later than the date of his attaining the maximum age for his group in the case of the employee who entered the service of the state police on or after July 1, 1996; and withhold on each pay day 11 per cent of the regular compensation of each employee who participates in the alternative superannuation retirement benefit established under section 104 of chapter 32; but in the case of any teacher the withholding shall be made upon written notice from the school committee or board of trustees or other employing authority, to the treasurer or other disbursing officer of the political subdivision by which the teacher is employed.

SECTION 50. (S34) Paragraph (b½) of said subdivision (1) of said section 22 of said chapter 32, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- The additional contributions required under this paragraph shall not apply to any employee who participates in the alternative superannuation retirement benefit program established in section 104.

✓ SECTION 51. [REDRAFT.S35H220.TM]. Section 103 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding the following:-

(i) Notwithstanding the provisions of (c) to the contrary, the board of any system may, by accepting the provisions of this as hereinafter provided, elect annually to pay a cost-of-living increase greater than the percentage increase, as recommended in the report prepared in accordance with paragraph (f) of subdivision (3) of section 21 for that year, but not greater than 3 per cent. The board shall conduct such election in a public meeting, properly posted, called specifically for such election. The board shall also notify each legislative body at least 30 days before such election.

Acceptance of this subsection shall be by a majority vote of the board of such system, subject to the approval of the legislative body. For the purpose of this section, "legislative body" shall mean, in the case of a city, the city council in accordance with its charter, in the case of a town, the town meeting, in the case of a county, the county retirement board advisory council, in the case of a district, the district members, and, in the case of an authority, the governing body. Acceptance of this subsection shall be deemed to have occurred upon the filing of the certification of such vote with the commission. A decision to accept the provisions of this subsection may not
