At the end of the year 1932 Mr. Donnelly voluntarily was retired as Superintendent of Parks, but never lost interest in the public affairs of Cambridge. He was always looked upon as a faithful and conscientious employee.

I respectfully recommend that suitable action be taken by your honorable board as a tribute of respect to his memory, in which action I shall, of course, join.

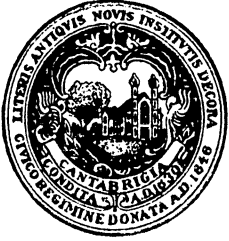

Notice has been received of the death of John F. Donnelly, a former employee of the Park Department, it becomes the duty of the City Council to take suitable action in memory of the deceased.

Mr. Donnelly served the City of Cambridge and served it well and honorably for almost half a century. Beginning as an humble day laborer he advanced gradually through the ranks to the position of foreman, from which post he was selected to head the Park Department almost thirty years ago. The excellent condition of the trees in the City of Cambridge bear mute testimony to the knowledge and skill he acquired in this line. In 1932 he retired from active service and was placed upon the pension roll of the city. After a short illness he died on October 27th.

He was born in Ireland and it can be truthfully said that, although an ardent and patriotic American citizen, his love for the mother country was constant and true. This was best exemplified by his work in the Ancient Order of Hibernians, a truly representative Irish organization, as a leading member of which he was known from one end of the country to the other.

The City of Cambridge, in his death, has lost an honorable and loyal citizen, his family a fond and devoted father, the Irish people a conservative, conscientious and popular leader. He will be sadly missed in the various walks of life. It is therefore
