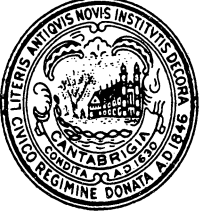

Subject Lighting in the Cambridge Common

I would like to present the following suggestions in response to Councillor Duehay's Order of June 7, 1982, regarding lighting in the Cambridge Common.

Barring replacement of the existing fixtures, we suggest intensifying the light they can generate. The Community Development Department specified similar fixtures with higher wattage and larger exposure in the Alfred E. Vellucci Community Plaza at Inman Square. In that situation we used the same light standard only with a 250 watt, mercury vapor luminaire in a 24 inch diameter disk. Lexan panels were also used for vandal resistance.

Other alternatives might include increasing the number of fixtures and lowering the light source to 12 or 14 feet so that the trees don't obscure the light.

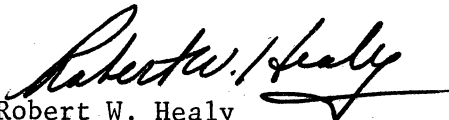
