- WHEREAS: Through the years John's ability was recognized by his superiors, who promoted him to the position of Foreman and later as Supervisor of the Machine Shop, the position from which he retired; and
- WHEREAS: John has long been active in local civic and veteran affairs and is a Past Commander of the American Legion Post #442; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere best wishes to John Messina on the occasion of his retirement, and to further extend every good wish for a healthy and happy retirement; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to John on behalf of the entire City Council.
