

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To receive and accept any property by way of gift, bequest, or devise from anyone to be held and administered in for the benefit and use of the following charitable and educational purposes:

To collect and disseminate information regarding the rehabilitation of children with emotional disturbances, drug addiction or other learning disabilities. These children may include but are not limited to those who are behind in their school work and are not working up to their normal capacity.

To purchase, lease or build schools or institutions of learning wherein the conduct of research and promotion of an ideal program for the help of such children including consultation and group therapy of other family members as appropriate, can be studied and corrected.

To establish and carry on nonprofit schools where students may obtain a sound remedial education; to provide for the holding of lectures, exhibitions, public meetings, classes, and conferences, calculated directly or indirectly to advance the cause of assisting the emotionally disturbed or other with learning difficulties.

To do any and all other lawful things in furtherance of said charitable and educational purposes which may be permitted under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue code of 1954 and which are also permitted under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, each as now in force of hereafter amended.

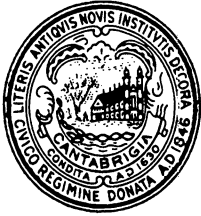
2. Purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

This corporation is not organized for the pecuniary profit of its directors, officers, or members; nor may it issue stock nor declare nor distribute dividends, and no part of its net income shall inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member; and any balance of money or assets remaining after the full payment of corporate obligations of any and all kinds shall be devoted solely to the charitable, educational and benevolent purposes of the corporation.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

- a) to increase the number of minority students participating in higher education qua students
- b) to help insure that the higher education experience of minority students is a fuller one (i.e. to attempt to make increased financial assistance available, to help increase necessary supportive services)

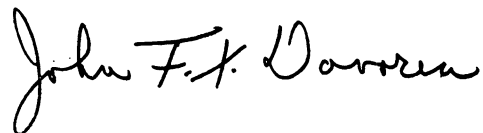
