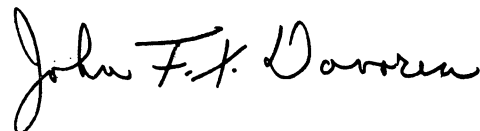

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

(1) To study and promote, on a wholly non-partisan basis, proposed and needed legislation affecting the social, educational, economic, physical and emotional needs of children and families;

(2) To engage in public education and service concerning the needs of children;

(3) To encourage effective and coordinated administration of public programs relating to children;

(4) To provide expertise, technical knowledge, factual information, and other assistance to public and private organizations concerned with children;

(5) To initiate, develop and support future programs relating to children;

Remainder set out on continuation sheet 2A.

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 3 and 4 is not sufficient additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out. Continuation sheets shall be on 8½" x 11" paper and must have a left-hand margin 1 inch wide for binding. Only one side should be used.

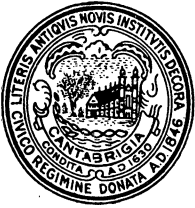
(6) To promote adequate appropriations of public funds for all of the above purposes.

(7) To solicit and receive dues, contributions, loans and grants of money and gifts from any and all sources in order to further the purposes set forth.

(8) To enter into, modify, rescind, cancel, perform and guarantee the performance of contracts of any kind or description which may be necessary or convenient to accomplish the purposes of the corporation.

(9) To lease, buy or otherwise acquire and to own, occupy, operate, mortgage, invest in, sub-lease, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of real estate, interests in real estate, and all other real and personal property, tangible and intangible, as may be necessary or incidental to the purposes of the corporation.

(10) To have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of Massachusetts as are in furtherance of the purposes herein set forth in the same manner and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, consistent with chapter 180 of the General Laws of Massachusetts.
