Cedar & Dudley Streets

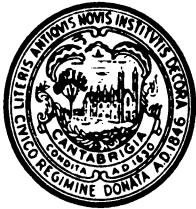
Sleeper Park was inspected on this date Jan. 6, 1987, and at this time the park is covered with snow. Therefore we cannot tell what the litter situation is. A small amount of glass was removed from one of the walk ways and this was the only glass visible at this time.

All the playground equipment is in fair to good condition, and as soon as the snow is melted the entire area will be cleaned up as needed.

The sand box area will be raked out, and if necessary new sand added. This park is serviced twice a week in the warm months and once a week in the winter months.

The drinking and littering in this park is a year round problem. In the past I have contacted the Police Dept. and they have increased their patrols in the park area. This seems to relieve the problem to a degree.
