- WHEREAS: It was with great pleasure that this City Council learned that Steven Weinberg, Higgins Professor of Physics at Harvard and a Cambridge resident was awarded the 1979 Nobel Prize in Physics by the Royal Academy of Sciences in Stockholm, Sweden; and
- WHEREAS: Professor Weinberg will share the prize with another Harvard Professor, Sheldon L. Glashow, and Professor Abdus Salam of Trieste, Italy, who never actually worked together, were all honored for their complementary investigations on the theory known as the "Weinberg-Salam Theory of Weak Interactions"; and
- WHEREAS: Professor Weinberg had been working on this theory since he was a student at Princeton University in 1957; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere congratulations to Professors Weinberg, Glashow and Salam on the occasion of their being the recipients of the 1979 Nobel Prize for Physics; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to these distinguished scientists on behalf of the entire City Council.
