WHEREAS: It is clear that the city will face financial constraints in the coming years; and

WHEREAS: As a center of technology, the city government of Cambridge should be able to utilize the most advanced technology to further its task of providing outstanding city services at reasonable cost; and

WHEREAS: Through the efforts of the City Manager, the Assistant City Manager, and the Data Processing Department, much progress has been made in recent years, but much work is still needed to bring every department's use of technology to a standard where its efficiency and responsiveness is where it should be in the late twentieth century; and

WHEREAS: The city is in a financial position to improve services through one-time investments in technology, but not through increased operating costs, and in fact will need to find ways to reduce costs; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager establish and chair a technology committee whose purpose is to recommend ways in which the city can better utilize communication, data processing, or other advanced equipment to improve city services while reducing operating costs, such initial recommendations to impact the next fiscal year; and be it further

ORDERED: That this committee includes appropriate contributors from the universities and businesses in the city as well as Cambridge citizens who can contribute to the technology and service aspects of this problem.

In City Council October 15, 1990.
