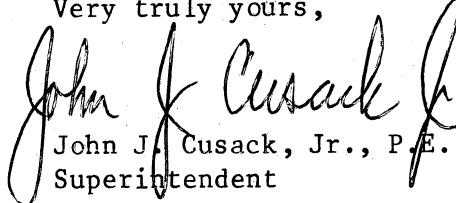

Dear Mr. Healy;

Enclosed is a copy of a statement Governor Dukakis will shortly make declaring the week of June 5th through June 11th as Water Conservation Week. It seems apparent that this might be the appropriate time to recognize and applaud the water conservation efforts of the residents of Cambridge. From 1973 to 1982, our water supply demand has declined by 30%, from 22.27 MGD in 1973 to 15.46 MGD in 1982.

I would like to recommend that a request be made to the Mayor's Office that a similar declaration be made at a forthcoming Council meeting prior to June 5th.

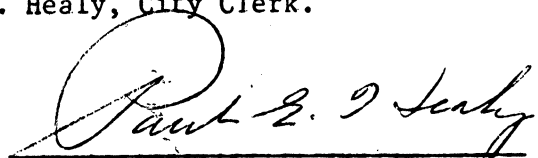
