COUNCILLOR WALSH

WHEREAS: In recent weeks concern has been raised about the removal of stately old trees which are in the way of or border the lot lines of new construction projects. The planned removal of two such trees along Harvard Street at the Gulf Station site exemplified the fact that a better balance must be struck between promoting the new and preserving the old. One resident said it well in his letter where he wrote, "We need to realize the true value (economic, social and health) of THE CAMBRIDGE LOOK—the tree lined streets..."; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: It is the sense of this City Council that a much greater effort be made by property owners, developers and various city departments to preserve the magnificent trees as development/construction plans are drawn up and move forward. Further, it is the sense of this City Council, should time still permit, that Harvard University make an effort to adapt its plans for the Gulf Station site so as to preserve the two trees in question; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a duly engrossed copy of this resolution be transmitted to Harvard's President Derek Bok and copies of same be transmitted to the Commissioner of Public Works and the Assistant City Manager for Community Development; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager advise the City Council of response to this matter when and as it may be received.
