Thomas F. Gibson served four terms as City Councillor prior to his election to the House of Representatives in 1938, and served with U. S. Navy in World War II where he attained the rank of Lt. Commander, and

WHEREAS:

Thomas F. Gibson returned to the service of the City of Cambridge in September of 1945 where his training as an attorney and legislative experience provided the Board of Assessors with a wealth of knowledge which was invaluable in the resolution of involved technical problems, and

WHEREAS:

The City of Cambridge has lost an outstanding public official in the retirement of this popular Assessor who earned the respect of all who had the good fortune to know him in his official duties, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council, in behalf of the citizens of Cambridge, extend to Thomas F. Gibson its gratitude for serving the University City so long and so well, and in bidding him a fond adieu, sends their best wishes for good health, prosperity and happiness in the years to come.
