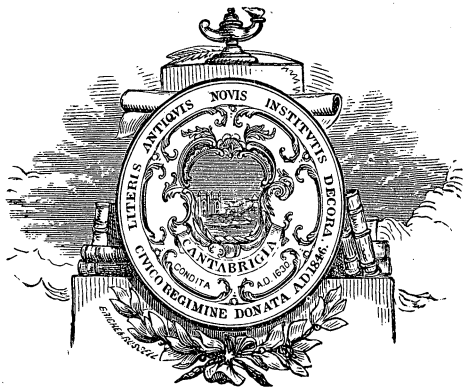




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

July 31, 1883

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Fourth Street, between Essex and Bridge Streets,*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,
