Section 2 No drove of cattle or Swine numbering more than twenty-five, or of Sheep or other animals numbering more than fifty, shall be driven in, over or through ~~any of the streets or bridges~~ ^{the following streets} of the city, ~~nor~~ ^{nor} with less than ~~four~~ ^{two} competent attendants or drivers to each drove of twenty-five cattle or Swine, or fifty sheep or other animals.

Section 3 No maddened, vicious, securely or dangerous animal shall be driven in, through or over any Street or Bridge of the City.

Section 3 Any person offending against any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. No drove of cattle a sume amounting
more than twenty-five, or of sheep or other ani-
mals amounting more than fifty, shall be driven
in, over, or through, the following streets, places,
or bridges of the City, to wit, that part of
North Avenue south of the Railroad Bridge,
Howard Square, Brighton Street, River Street,
West Boston Bridge, Canal Bridge, or Prison
Point Bridge, with less than two competent
attendants or drivers to each drove of twenty-
five cattle or swine, or fifty sheep or other
animals.

Sec. 2. No unclenched, vicious, unruly or
dangerous animal shall be driven in, through,
or over any street or bridge of the City.

Sec. 3. Any person offending against any of the
provisions of this Ordinance, shall, on conviction
thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceed-

ing two by dollars.
