To the Hon Board Mayor and
Aldermen of the City of Cambridge

Respectfully represents the undersigned
Pamelia W. Bright that she is the
owner of a house on the West Side
of North Third Street at the corner
of Gore and Third Streets - that the steps
leading into said house from Third
Street have occupied the position that
they now occupy for more than
forty years as will appear by the
affidavits hereto annexed - which
secure to her the right to have them
so remain -

That she has received a notice of an
order passed by the board of Aldermen
Aug 7. 1872 - requiring all encroachments
to be removed.

That she is advised & informed - that if she
removes her steps in pursuance of
said notice - she can have no legal
claim upon said City of Cambridge for

damages occasioned to her by
said removal - and that she
is informed that said steps cannot
be removed and a new entrance made
to said house for a sum less than
one hundred ^{& twenty five} dollars besides
other injury to said estate

Wherefore your petitioner asks
that the said City will award
to her ~~the sum of~~ a fair compensation for
damages occasioned ~~by~~ the removal
of said steps ~~and~~ or pass some
order or make some reference
in regard to said matter whereby
she may be enabled to act in the
premises without endangering her
legal rights.
