The Committee on Roads and Bridges of this board, to which was referred the petition of the Masson & Hamlin Organ Co, praying that a license may be granted to said Company, under the provisions of Chapter 299 of the Acts of the year 1872, and all acts in addition and amendment thereof, to use a cellar under the factory of said Company at the corner of Broadway and Brewery Street, at a depth of six and one-half feet below the grade of said Broadway, - and also to construct and use a Coal bunker under the sidewalk of said Broadway, adjoining and in front of the middle building of said factory, the same to be built at the same grade as the basement of said middle building: -

To the Honorable Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the city of Cambridge in the County of Middlesex

Respectfully represents your petitioner the Mason and Hamlin Organ and Piano Company a corporation established under the laws of the Commonwealth that it is necessary for the accommodation of the machinery of its factory situated in that part of Cambridge called Cambridgeport at the junction of Broadway and Brewery Street that the cellar should be deepened under ~~the east wing~~ of said factory to the depth of six and a half feet below the grade of said Broadway and that a coal bunker should be constructed under the sidewalk on said Broadway in front of and adjoining the middle building of said factory; it therefore prays that it may be licensed under Chapter two hundred and ninety-nine of the acts of the year 1872 and all acts in addition to and amendment thereof by your honorable board to construct and
