- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge recently hosted teams from around the world in preliminary soccer matches of the XXIII Olympiad; and
- WHEREAS: These Olympic soccer games drew a total of 132,846 fans to Harvard Stadium on six successive evenings; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Police Department, in cooperation with the Harvard Police and federal law enforcement agencies, oversaw the security of the Olympic participants, officials, spectators and dignitaries, including Vice-President George Bush; and
- WHEREAS: The Games and Opening Ceremonies, with the exception of a few stray skydivers, proceeded without incident, showing the nation and the world the professionalism and dedication of the Cambridge Police Department; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulate and commend the entire Cambridge Police Department, and in particular Chief Anthony Paolillo, Captain William Burke, Lt. Timothy Toomey, Lt. Donald Carney and Inspector William Maher, for the exceptional job done providing security for all those involved in the Olympic Soccer Games at Harvard Stadium.
