IN CITY COUNCIL

April 25, 1977

ORDERED:

That in accordance with the provisions of the General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge, Chapter 3, Section 3-2, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to William S. Fischer, doing business as The Caning Shoppe, for the purpose of displaying and selling merchandise on the sidewalk in front of the premises numbered 2362-4 Massachusetts Avenue, provided that no such permit shall be granted to exceed more than twenty-five per cent of the width of the sidewalk from the property line of the premises in front of which said display shall be installed and providing further that before erecting the above named display, the petitioner shall file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge from all claims for damages arising from the construction, maintenance and use of said display.

To the Honorable, the City Council of the
City of Cambridge:

The undersigned respectfully pray
your consideration on granting a sidewalk display permit to
the Caning Shoppe.

We would like to use 25% of the sidewalk that runs di-
rectly in front of our store fronts (2362-4 Massachusetts
Avenue, North Cambridge). At no point will we extend more
than 25% of the way across the sidewalk from the building.

We would use the space to display chairs which we are
selling. At times we would set a small counter out with some
of the materials we use to cane the chairs so that we can dem-
onstrate the work we do.

We would use the space only during daylight hours when
the store is open.

As required, we will obtain a \$2,000 bond from our insur-
ance agent, W. T. Phelan and Co., 11 Dunster Street, Cambridge
to cover any liabilities caused by our presence on the side-
walk.

We feel that our display will add unique character to
the North Cambridge area. As craftspersons we are providing
an unusual service that is used by the people of Cambridge
and draws many people from outside of Cambridge to the area.

We feel that an interesting sidewalk display is an effec-
tive unobtrusive way of letting people know we are here.
