WHEREAS: This City Council has learned from the Affordable Housing Landbank Process and the Area IV Teen Center Process that the city's current notion of how to access community input and involvement leaves much to be desired; and

WHEREAS: Simply placing ads in the Cambridge Chronicle and/or on cable television is not sufficient outreach; and

WHEREAS: Neighborhood study groups have in the past not been chosen with appropriate geographical representation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Council Committee on Housing and Community Development have meetings and at least one or more public hearings on developing a fair, effective process for community input; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Committee develop standard guidelines such that, if these guidelines were followed, a prima facie case could be made that sufficient outreach had been undertaken.
