WHEREAS: An amendment to the United States Constitution to require a balanced budget is now pending before Congress; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the Cambridge City Council urge the Massachusetts Congressional Delegation to determine, prior to voting on this amendment, exactly what budget cuts would be required to implement it; and be it further

ORDERED: That, unless basic provisions and responsibilities of the Federal government relating to Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid and housing are exempted from such budget cuts, the Massachusetts Congressional delegation be urged to oppose this amendment.
