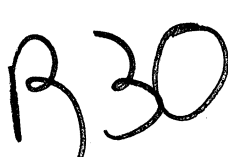

Ora M. De Jesus, 73

Professor, nursing board member

Mrs. Ora M. (De Moranville) De Jesus of Wareham, an associate professor at the University of Massachusetts-Dartmouth and a member of the state board of nursing, died Saturday in St. Elizabeth Medical Center in Brighton. She was 73.

Mrs. De Jesus was born and raised in Lakeville.

In the 1960s, she and her husband, Henry, enrolled at Apponequet Regional High School to complete their high school education. They were both in their mid-30s at the time.

She was a member of the first graduating class of Taunton Vocational School of Practical Nursing and began a career as a licensed nurse.

In 1966, Mrs. De Jesus earned her associate's degree from Newton Junior College. She earned her bachelor's degree in nursing from Salve Regina College in 1975. Three years later she received her master's degree in nursing from Boston University. Mrs. De Jesus was also a certified geriatric nurse practitioner.

Most recently, she was an associate professor and executive director of the Gerontology Center at UMass-Dartmouth.

She was appointed to the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Nursing, was a member of the Task Force on Aging, and a frequent lecturer in the region.

Mrs. De Jesus was honored by the Massachusetts Federation of Nursing Homes, and was the recipient of the Ethel S. O'Brien Advocacy Award.
