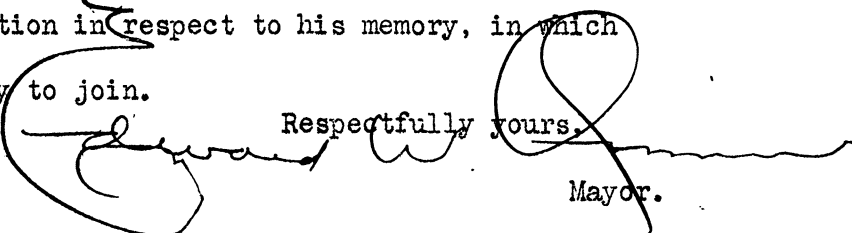
The Honorable, the City Council:
