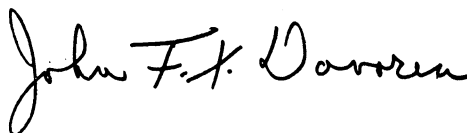

TASK FORCE ON THE HANDICAPPED, INC.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

- A. To establish a resource center and clearinghouse to serve the handicapped and the general public by the supplying of information concerning medicine, equipment, rehabilitation, training, housing, transportation, employment and any and all other areas relating to the well-being and betterment of the handicapped and, in general, to aid the handicapped in all of their problems.

(Continued 2A)

To educate the public as to the facts concerning the handicapped; to cooperate with all segments of the community, with governmental agencies and with other organizations in dealing with and solving the problems of the handicapped; to prepare others to deal with the problems of the handicapped; to propose programs and to secure public and industrial consideration of the problems of the handicapped in their programs and activities; to publish material of and concerning the problems of the handicapped; and to carry on and conduct any and all other activities necessary, convenient or desirable to solve the problems of the handicapped.

To receive and accept any property, including, without limitation, cash, stocks, bonds, and all forms of donations and gifts, and to otherwise raise money from all sources, public and private, for the above outlined purposes.

- B. Solely in furtherance of the above purposes, the corporation shall have and may exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts upon non-profit corporations and all of the following additional powers:

To purchase, receive, take by grant, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, lease or otherwise acquire, own, hold improve, employ, use and otherwise deal in and with, real or personal property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;

To sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of, or mortgage, pledge, encumber or create a security interest in, all or any of its property, or any interest therein, wherever situated;

To purchase, take, receive, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, vote, employ, sell, lend, lease, exchange, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, use and otherwise deal in and with, bonds and other obligations, shares, or other securities or interests issued by others;

To make contracts, give guarantees and incur liabilities, borrow money at such rates of interest as the corporation may determine, issue its notes, bonds and other obligations and secure any of its obligations by mortgage, pledge or encumbrance of, or security interest in, all or any of its property or any interest therein, wherever situated;

To lend money, invest and reinvest its funds, and take and hold real and personal property as security for the payment of funds so loaned or invested;

To carry on its activities and operations, and have offices and exercise its powers in any jurisdiction within or without the United States;

To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is formed; provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with this chapter or the general laws of the commonwealth.

C. The following additional provisions are hereby established for the regulation of the Corporation:

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, officers, directors, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes as herein set forth.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Organization, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

In the event of the termination, dissolution or winding up of the affairs of the corporation in any manner and for any reason whatsoever, all of the corporation's assets remaining after payment or provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, shall be conveyed or distributed to and only to an organization or organizations exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). In no event shall any of the profits, income or assets of the corporation, whether derived from dues, gifts or other sources, be distributed upon dissolution to any member of the corporation.

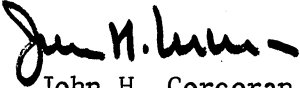
