In response to City Council #8 of 11/5/90 regarding vehicles of Excel Car and Limousine Rental (corner of Western/Franklin/River) blocking the visibility of oncoming traffic, Lieutenant Thomas Benson of the Traffic Division has been instructed to visit the establishment and attempt to alleviate the situation.

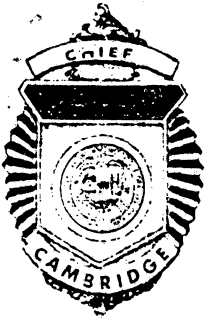

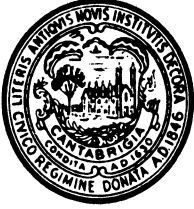
