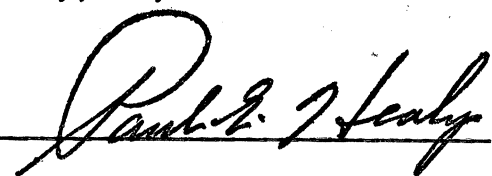

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Henry J. Bornhofft, late President of Nabisco Confections of Cambridge and Vice-President of Nabisco Brands U.S.A.; and
- WHEREAS: Henry, upon graduating from Belmont High School went on to earn a Bachelor of Science Degree at Boston University's College of Business Administration in 1943, and while at B.U. he was active on the varisty crew and was Treasurer of Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity and served as Class President; and
- WHEREAS: Henry served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Army holding the rank of Lieutenant, serving in the 104th Timberwolf Division in Europe, where his division was first to cross the Rhine, and while seeing action in the European Theatre Mr. Bornhofft was wounded three times and was the recipient of the Purple Heart with two oak leaf clusters, the Bronze and Silver Stars for meritorious service, prior to being honorably discharged Mr. Bornhofft was promoted to the rank of Captain; and
- WHEREAS: Henry's career in the confectionery industry began at the Walter Baker Chocolate Company in 1947 as a Sales Manager, working there until 1953 at which time he joined the Squirrel Brand Company serving as Vice-President, and in 1969 became General Manager of the Nabisco Merckens Chocolate Division and rose through the ranks to attain the Presidency of the company's five operating divisions nationwide; and
- WHEREAS: Henry was also active in civic and community affairs, having served as a member of the Finance Committee and Town Meeting member in Dedham, as well as serving on several boards of lending and educational institutions; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Nancy Bornhofft and the entire Bornhofft family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Bornhofft on behalf of the entire City Council.
