The primary concern of the moment is how to cope with this emergency as we head into winter so that the needs of the elderly and the handicapped residents can be met effectively while simultaneously preserving a policy for parking which will provide for the efficient removal of snow, should such prove necessary; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager meet with the appropriate Department Heads, together with the property manager from Huron Towers, in an effort to work out a plan of action which, until the project is completed, will assist the residents of Huron Towers who are most seriously impacted due to age or health, and at the same time will be responsive to the demands which various city departments must confront during a usually unpredictable winter; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council before November 30, 1989 with a report as to what has been agreed upon in this matter.
