COUNCILLOR MYERS

WHEREAS: On October 28 and 29, signs were posted on Chalk Street and Fairmont Street for no parking due to tree trimming; and

WHEREAS: On those dates, no one came to trim the trees; and

WHEREAS: Citizens who called the public works department were told that either the trees would be trimmed on the 29th or that the signs would be taken down, and instead the trees will apparently be trimmed for October 30, meaning that there will be a third day with no parking for residents on these streets; and

WHEREAS: This miscommunication has created some difficulty for residents, including at least one, a handicapped space; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works to send a letter of explanation and apology, if appropriate, explaining to the residents why this situation occurred in the way that it did and kindly letting the City Council know the outcome of this situation.
