RE: Gateway Cities Allocation

The Executive Office of Communities and Development has granted the City of Cambridge \$239,706.54 under the Gateway Cities program. This is a new program created by the state legislature, designed to assist municipalities which have had an influx of recent immigrants. Cambridge is one of 26 Gateway Cities in the Commonwealth.

The Department of Human Service Programs conducted and publicized an open Request for Proposal process for municipal departments and non profit agencies serving recent immigrants. Proposals were reviewed by the Cambridge Gateways Advisory Group, a citizen body with representation from the Cambridge Human Service Commission and immigrant groups. They recommended the following allocation of the funds:

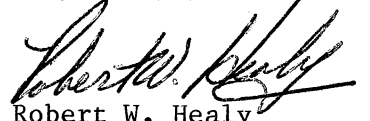

To the Honorable, the City Council:

Attached is an order requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Executive Office of Communities and Development for \$239,706.54 to the Human Services Other Ordinary Maintenance account to provide funds for programs to assist recent immigrants who need specialized services and/or better access to services. Requests for Proposals from both municipal departments and non-profit agencies serving recent immigrant groups were reviewed by the Gateways Advisory Group. This group, which is comprised of members of the Cambridge Human Services Commission and immigrant groups, recommended funding for education, mental health, and legal services programs as well as necessary administrative costs.
