RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Jill Herold on behalf of the entire City Council.

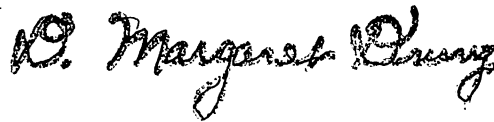

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Geraldine "Jill" Herold will retire from the Human Services Department effective December 31, 2003; and
- WHEREAS: Jill began her more than twenty-five year tenure with the City of Cambridge in 1978 when she became the Director of Human Service Planning in the Community Development Department; and
- WHEREAS: Jill undertook an extensive study of human services which eventually lead to the creation of the Department of Human Services Program (DHSP); and
- WHEREAS: Jill became the head of DHSP which was created by ordinance. In 1980 Jill became the Assistant City Manager for Human Services, the position she held through her retirement; and
- WHEREAS: Jill has worked tirelessly to improve the quality of life for all Cambridge residents. Under Jill's leadership DHSP has become an envied model for other cities and towns with its excellent services for children, youth, families, seniors, homeless families, individuals and people with disabilities; and
- WHEREAS: The City developed, under Jill's leadership, a wide range of after school programs for children and youth, nurtured a continuum of care including the Multi-Service Center for the homeless, established a system of contracting with community agencies for services, built or renovated youth centers and the Cambridge Senior Center; and
- WHEREAS: Jill has served as an officer of the Local Officials Human Services Council in Massachusetts and the U.S. Conference of City Human Services Officials in Washington and was appointed by the governor to co-chair the Statewide Day Care Advisory Committee in the 1980's; now therefore be it
