

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT.

Memorandum made and entered into this nineteenth day of June A.D. 1889, by and between Martin W. Sands, of Cambridge, party of the first part, and the City of Cambridge, party of the second part,

Witnesseth:-

That said party of the first part hereby promises and agrees at his own expense that he shall and will from time to time furnish and deliver from his own yards in said Cambridge, and at such place or places as shall from time to time be designated by the Superintendent of Streets of said City, such quantities of paving brick to the amount of five hundred thousand (500,000) more or less as required by said Superintendent for the use of said City, the same to be of the best quality, hand struck and water struck, and of the following dimensions, viz. length, eight (8) inches; width, three and one half (3 1-2) inches; thickness, two and one quarter (2 1-4) inches; and well burned with wood and to be subject to inspection and rejection if not suitable for the purposes required and to the entire satisfaction of the Committee on Roads and Bridges and the Superintendent of Streets of said City.

And if he shall furnish and deliver any further amount, it shall be at the same rate, until a new agreement is made.

And the party of the second part in consideration thereof promises and agrees to pay to the party of the first part the sum of thirteen (\$13.00) dollars for each thousand of said paving bricks so furnished and delivered, upon and after the approval of said Committee and Superintendent.
