Gymnasts compete in USA Gymnastics meet

Ruby Bagedonow, 8, and Kate Sanders-Fleming, 11, competed in USA Gymnastics State Championship in Northborough on Dec. 15. The athletes competed with 100 of the top Level 5 female gymnasts of eastern Massachusetts.

Bagedonow was awarded fourth all-around in the 7-8 age group with a score of 33. She won second place in the uneven bars and fourth-place medals in the vault, beam and floor exercises. Sanders-Fleming scored 33.7 points in the age 11-12 group.

Bagedonow, daughter of Christine and Matthew, is in the third

grade at the Peabody School. Seventh grader Sanders-Fleming, daughter of Alison and Duncan, is in the ISP Program at the Longfellow School.

The young Cantabrigians are members of the Masstars Team coached by Patrick Palmer and Shixin Mao. They train 10 hours a week at the Massachusetts Gymnastics Center in Waltham.
