WHEREAS: Approximately sixty percent of all housing in the City of Cambridge is over eighty-five years old with much of it in substandard condition; and

WHEREAS: The health and well-being of all our Cambridge residents, a vital concern of this City Council, is in jeopardy when the potential for fire or other hazards exist; and

WHEREAS: The Commissioner of the Inspectional Services Department in order to properly carry out his responsibilities under the State Sanitary Code and Building Code and to properly protect the health and well-being of the people of Cambridge, is authorized to develop and adopt plans for the systematic, periodic inspection of housing: dwellings, dwelling units, rooming houses and rooming units; therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be requested to direct the Commissioner of the Inspectional Services Department to comply with the State Code by developing and implementing a substantive procedure for the systematic inspection of all housing in the City of Cambridge; and be it further

ORDERED: That no steps be taken to implement this order until the reports of the Inspectional Services Department and other departments and agencies of the City who are concerned with housing problems, have reported their role in the inspection procedure to this City Council for review.
