Subject City Council Order No. 18

City Council Order No. 18 of April 2, 1979, which was introduced by Councillor Walter J. Sullivan was discussed by the full Board at its meeting on April 17, 1979.

The Board, after due consideration, voted unanimously to make no change in its fee structure, namely, to charge all licensees the same fee, regardless of age.

The Board's decision was based on the following:

1. It would be discriminatory to permit lodging house licensees to operate without paying a fee and require all other licensees (Auctioneers, Bowling Alleys, Common Victualer, Drivers, etc.) regardless of age, to pay the fee applicable to their licenses.
2. In the interest of economy, these lodging house fees were increased this year so that the License Commission could keep within the Governor's spending cap.
3. Notice of this increase was sent to approximately 230 lodging house licensees and objection to this increase was registered by only three licensees.

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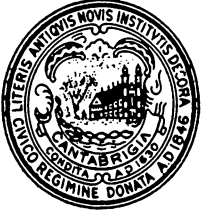

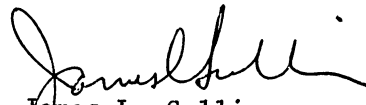
