The Fire Rescue Squad respond not only to emergency medical runs but to each and every alarm of fire whether it is an actual fire or a false alarm, and

WHEREAS:

Each member of the Fire Rescue Squad receives intensive emergency medical training so as to insure the competence of any one of these men to handle any emergency that may confront them, and

WHEREAS:

In 1973 the Fire Rescue Squad responded to 4591 calls throughout the City of Cambridge as well as aiding their brother firefighters at all alarms of fire, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That I, Walter J. Sullivan, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, September 24, 1974 as "Cambridge Fire Rescue Squad Day" in commemoration of all past and present firefighters who have served in the Rescue Squad, in honor of their truly outstanding and magnificent work helping to save lives whenever humanly possible, and be it further

That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a copy of this proclamation to the officers and members of the Fire Rescue Squad as official recognition of their dedication to duty and their tireless efforts to help mankind.
