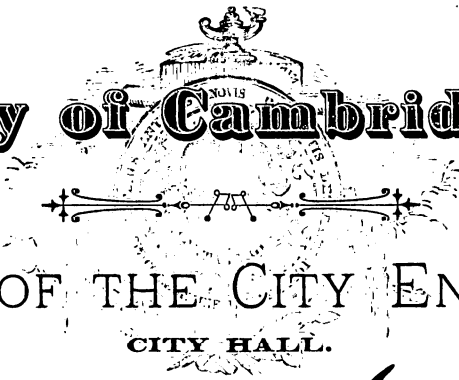

To the Hon the Mayor & Aldermen
Gentlemen

The attention of the undersigned has been called to an alleged encroachment on Battle Street, the said encroachment being a building standing across said street near Charles River. A personal examination shows that a duck house 10 feet long by 5 feet in width has been erected as described. The party having erected the same, makes no claim of right there, but thought no objection could arise. He is willing to remove it should your Hon Board deem it desirable. There is also a large pile of drift wood piled across said street which should be removed, and a gate placed in the fence across said street, erected by the City would afford better access to the river for launching^{to} and removing boats from the same, which is as near as I can learn the principal ground of complaint
