- WHEREAS: This sampling of area residents produced alarming stories of increased cancer diagnoses and deaths particularly in a four block area bordered by Sixth Street, Charles Street, Cambridge Street and Third Street; and
- WHEREAS: It is incumbent upon government to provide for the health and safety of its residents; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Commissioner of Health and Hospitals and the appropriate officials of the State Cancer Registry at the Department of Public Health with a view in mind of conducting an exhaustive door to door interview process and report back to this City Council upon completion along with any and all recommendations to be considered by this body.
